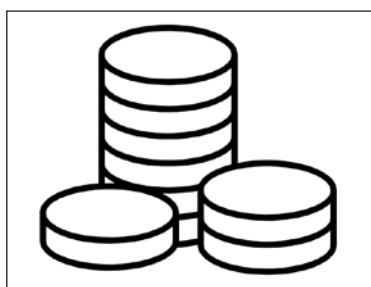

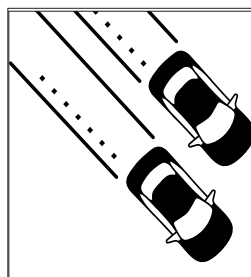
### Important Notice to All Treasurers.



#### MCPF Annual Subs

The subscription fee per club remains at £52.00 (consisting of £41.00 for the PAGB portion and £11.00 for the MCPF portion), with the PAGB keeping their rate steady.

The subscription fee per member is set to rise from 75p to 85p, reflecting economic challenges and increased travel costs.



#### Important update to Mileage Expenses for PAGB Judges and Lecturers

The government has announced an increase in the car mileage rate to 55p/mile backdated to April

2026. The rate had been 45p/mile since 2011. The PAGB has therefore increased its maximum mileage rate to 55p/mile. See more details on the Speakers page on PAGB website <https://thepagb.org.uk/services/speakers/>

55p/mile is not the cost of running any particular car: it is a compromise rate which HMRC will accept as expenses regardless of the actual car used. PAGB uses this maximum rate as a protection for listed speakers and also to provide some certainty to Clubs when planning their programmes.

For Clubs, the increase is just over 20%. For comparison, the CPI and RPI increases since 2011 are about 50% and 75% respectively

Best practice to check expenses at time of booking, plus remember to check if lecturer charges any additional fees.

## Photo Inspiration on the Move: The Federation's Travelling Portfolio

The Federation's Travelling Portfolio lets local photography clubs hire a curated collection of top-tier shots from the annual Photofolio Exhibition. It is an easy, affordable way to inspire your members and celebrate great local talent.

The Federation's Travelling Portfolio provides clubs with the opportunity to enjoy a representative selection of the outstanding work exhibited in the annual Photofolio Exhibition.

Photofolio is the Federation's annual exhibition of images submitted by member clubs and consists of two sections: mounted photographic prints, displayed during June at the AGM, and also Digital Projected Images (DPIs), presented as an audiovisual production with a carefully chosen musical soundtrack.

Following the exhibition, approximately 60 prints are selected to form the Travelling Portfolio. The selection is made to ensure that all participating clubs are represented while showcasing a diverse range of photographic subjects, styles and techniques.

To enhance the experience, an audiovisual presentation accompanies both the print and DPI sections. The print presentation features commentary from two highly respected photographers, offering their insight into the qualities they believe led to each image being selected for the exhibition. A separate audiovisual presentation is also available for the DPI section with a musical accompaniment.

The Travelling Portfolio is available to all Federation clubs for a modest hire fee and can be booked in one of two formats:

### Print Portfolio

The portfolio of selected prints circulates between clubs throughout the season according to a pre-arranged itinerary. Clubs are responsible for liaising with one another to ensure the portfolio is passed on by the agreed dates. Included with the prints are both audio visual files

### Digital Presentation

Clubs may alternatively book the audiovisual presentations without the print portfolio. These digital files are distributed at the start of the club season in September, providing a convenient and flexible option for club programmes.

The Travelling Portfolio is an excellent way for clubs to share and celebrate the high standard of photography produced across the Federation, while gaining inspiration and insight from the work of fellow photographers.

### The Quick Lowdown

\* **The Collection:** Around 60 awesome prints and digital images picked from the June exhibition, covering all kinds of styles.

\* **The Extras:** You get commentary explaining what makes the prints stand out, plus musical backdrops for the digital tracks.

\* **Option 1 (Print Portfolio):** Real, physical prints get passed from club to club on a set schedule, complete with matching audio-visual files.

\* **Option 2 (Digital Only):** Skip the physical prints and get the digital pdi shows sent straight to you in September to fit your own schedule.

\* **Why Do It?:** It is a cheap, fun way to spark new ideas, see what other clubs are up to, and learn from the pros.

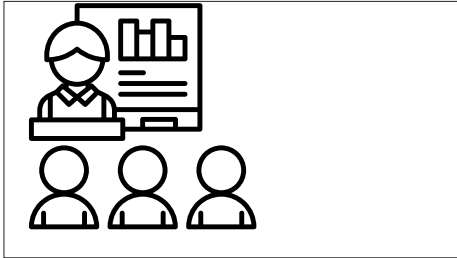

### MCPF APM Workshop Jennifer Box

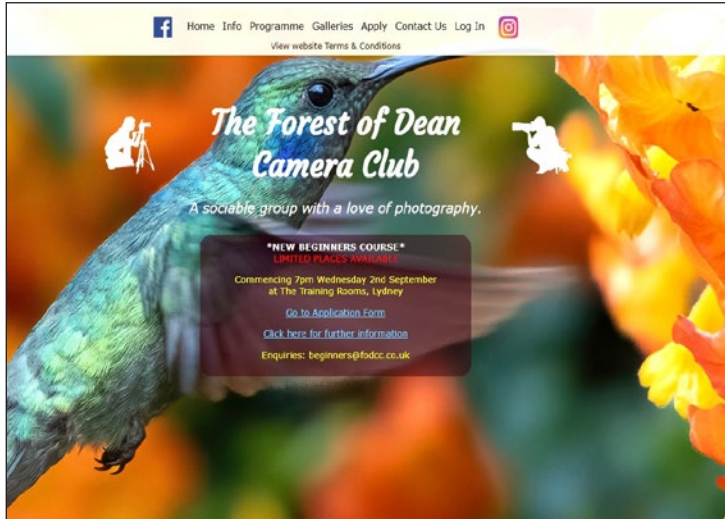
Having been thinking about beginning my journey towards PGAB accreditation, attending this introductory workshop proved to be an invaluable experience. The day clearly explained the process of getting started and set out the steps needed to work towards achieving that goal.

The afternoon workshop, where we presented our images for discussion and constructive critique, gave us a real insight into what is expected. There were so many helpful hints, practical tips, and words of encouragement throughout the day that it made the whole experience extremely worthwhile.

A sincere thank you to everyone who organised and delivered the workshop. Your knowledge, support, and willingness to help were greatly appreciated and made the day both enjoyable and inspiring.

And, of course, the tea and coffee went down a treat!

I shall certainly be returning for the next workshop.



Growing a photography club from 20 members to over 80 in a rural area sounds like one of those “simple” projects that turns out not to be simple at all.

After Covid, the Forest of Dean Camera Club had just over 20 members. Before the pandemic, membership had been around 40, so the challenge was obvious: rebuild the club and create something people genuinely wanted to be part of.

Fast forward to the end of the 2025/26 season and membership has passed 80. Not bad for an area where sheep probably outnumber photographers. People often ask what the secret is. The answer is slightly disappointing because there isn't one. It's lots of small things done consistently.

#### We show up

Every year we attend local food fairs, vintage shows, carnivals and community events. We display members' work, run slideshows, set up studio lighting and photograph visitors, their dogs, babies, grandparents – pretty

much anyone who stands still long enough. In return for free pitches, we provide organisers with images they can use for future publicity.

#### We stay visible

Our social media channels are active throughout the year. Our Facebook following has grown from around 250 to more than 800, alongside member groups, Instagram, WhatsApp and a website packed with photographs, information and resources.

#### We make people feel welcome

This sounds obvious, but it's probably the most important thing we do. New members aren't left standing awkwardly in a corner wondering if they've accidentally walked into the wrong room. People chat, share ideas, offer help and make newcomers feel part of the group from day one.

#### We help beginners

Our six-week beginner courses give people a straightforward introduction to photography without drowning them in jargon about histograms, dynamic range and other subjects guaranteed to make eyes glaze over after ten

minutes. Most participants go on to join the club.

We do more than meet indoors  
Summer trips, photo walks, coffee stops, pub meet-ups, street photography outings and visits to local attractions keep people involved even when the formal season ends.

We encourage participation  
Club challenges such as Footpaths and Waterworks encourage members to try subjects they might normally ignore. Some go on to enter national and international competitions, while others simply enjoy trying something new.

The reality is that membership growth doesn't come from one brilliant idea. It comes from being visible, being active and creating an environment where people enjoy spending time together.

Photography may be the reason people walk through the door. The community is the reason they stay.

And with a bit of luck, we'll be celebrating member number 100 before too long.



# ens: Why Community is the Secret to Membership Retention

How structured public visibility and year-round engagement helped one local photography group scale from 20 to over 80 members.

## Card Carrying Members

How many times when you are out and about do you see some bod with a big camera strung round their neck? And how many times do you then engage them in conversation?

Me, well quite often and then I have in my pocket a few of our cards, which I pass on to them. Sometimes I will just go up to the photographer and simply give them the card saying, 'This may be of interest to you' and leave it at that. Other times they may get a bit of a chat but nothing too intrusive.

This has resulted in several new members and also some folks were interested but lived a bit further away and they are now keeping an eye on the Facebook page and whilst not joining they do get the benefit of seeing our exploits and I know of at least one who comes along occasionally.

Don't bother if you are away in Scotland or say Iceland but in the Forest or at an event like the Coleford Civil War Re-enactment or the raft race down the Wye then that is fertile ground. Cards are available from the Club so ask a committee member for a few samples and make sure you have half a dozen in your pocket.

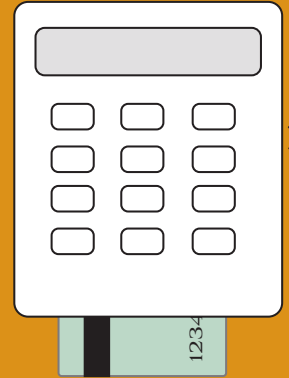
